

## **Parking worries exist for future light rail stations**

Aurora | There aren't enough parking spaces planned for the city's future light rail stations, members of city council said Monday night, Dec. 17.

Mayor Ed Tauer said Aurora's light rail line is expected to see 8,000 riders a day.

Councilwoman Sue Sandstrom said she wanted FasTracks officials to listen to Aurora's concerns as they design the light rail line.

"This whole process has me really frustrated because I feel like RTD is going full steam ahead and I don't think we've had adequate input," Sandstrom said.

FasTracks has held a handful of meetings to gather the public's input about how light rail stations in Aurora should evolve.

RTD officials could not be immediately reached for comment.

City council gave initial approval to conducting a parking study of its own, and plans to meet with light rail officials early next year.
