To Whom It May Concern;

Qwest plans to relocate or modify aerial and buried facilities in conjunction with the West Corridor phase of RTD FasTracks. These relocations will be negotiated based on design plans provided by RTD and their engineering contractor.

Based on the current RTD design plans, Qwest facility impacts vary in range from "Extreme Conflict" to "Slight Conflict". An "Extreme Conflict" may be defined as a 10 unit or greater duct/facility structure and utility vaults. A "Slight Conflict" may be defined as a service wire or small cable.

Typically Qwest does maintenance and cut over work transparently to the public and our customers. If service is interrupted it will likely be due to a force of nature, or damage to the facility in the area. Qwest resources will work diligently to restore any services as promptly as possible should an outage occur.

While Qwest plans to work with RTD and the other major utilities utilizing all of the existing space in both the RTD right of way and the public right of way, there may be sections where there is not enough physical space. In those situations it may become necessary for Qwest to pursue private utility easements for some facility relocations. Qwest will notify any prospective property owners and negotiate using Fair Market Value to secure exclusive easement rights.
