## **ROAD CLOSURES SCHEDULED FOR FASTRACKS WEST CORRIDOR CONSTRUCTION**

Lakewood, February 25, 2010 – West Corridor construction will close traffic lanes on the following roadways:

### **Closures:**

#### **Sunday, February 28, 2010 – Monday, March 1, 2010**

- All lanes of traffic on Federal between 10th Avenue and Howard Place will close at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, February 28<sup>th</sup> so West Corridor crews can set up traffic control equipment. Federal will reopen at 5:30 a.m. on Monday, March 1.
- The ramp from eastbound Colfax to southbound Federal will close at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, February 28<sup>th</sup> and remain closed for the duration of construction on Federal.

#### **Monday, March 1, 2010**

- When Federal reopens on Monday, March 1, traffic will be shifted to the west, but will remain two lanes in each direction between 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Howard Place. The traffic light at Holden Place and Federal will be removed prohibiting left turns from southbound Federal to eastbound Holden Place and left turns from westbound Holden Place to southbound Federal.
- The 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue onramp from Indiana Street will be closed from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. each day beginning on Monday, March 1 through Friday, March 5. The ramp will reopen daily at 3:30 p.m.

Be advised that all construction activities are weather-dependent and subject to change. FasTracks is RTD's voter-approved transit program to expand rail and bus service throughout the RTD service area. FasTracks will build 122 miles of commuter rail and light rail, 18 miles of bus rapid transit service, add 21,000 new parking spaces, redevelop Denver Union Station and redirect bus service to better connect the eight-county District. The FasTracks investment initiative is projected to create more than 10,000 jobs during the height of construction, and will pump billions of dollars into the regional economy.
